Launched in January 2022 for a duration of 24 months, the NWC project is developed by a consortium of specialized organizations from France, Belgium, Cyprus, Poland, the Netherlands, Italy and Spain.

NWC aims to set up a training program for trainers, workers and HR professionals who want to develop skills to face the new digital challenges of the world of work. NWC project is based on the idea that professionals, workers and HR need to acquire know-how, soft skills and soft competences to adapt to a changing world of work. 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Why this project?

Work has taken a new turn with the breakthrough of teleworking. Workplaces are becoming more flexible and diverse. In this new world of work with rapid technological advances, fueled by the COVID 19 crisis, companies have accelerated their digitization: work methods and workplaces have changed, as have processes and interactions. This new working environment, while it may have been perceived as hostile, has also proved to be

a fertile ground for the creation of new processes and the implementation of adapted tools.

Aware of these changes, we want to create a space for reflection and to provide tools and educational resources to help the different actors of a company to sustainably improve their work environment and their daily collaboration methods.
